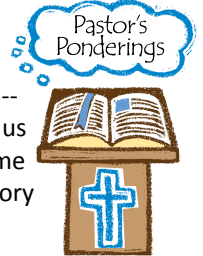

A SEASON OF WAITING

The season of Advent is certainly a time of watching and waiting -- but it is not meant to be passive nor even thoughtless. Advent is a time for us to be birthed into new possibilities and new realities. We are to use this time of waiting as our preparation for things to come. I invite you to hear this story about the importance of waiting.



A monk found the cocoon of a butterfly. One day, a small opening appeared, and he sat and watched the butterfly for several hours, as it struggled to force its body through the little hole. Then it seemed to stop making progress. It appeared as if it had gotten as far as it could muster and could go no further. The monk decided to help the butterfly, so he took a pair of scissors and snipped off the remaining bit of cocoon. The butterfly then emerged easily, but it had a swollen body and small, shriveled wings.

The monk continued to watch the butterfly because he expected that at any moment its wings would enlarge and expand enough to be able to support its body, which would contract in time. Neither happened!

In fact, the butterfly spent the rest of its life crawling around with a swollen body and shriveled wings. Although the monk took very good care of the butterfly for all of its days, it was never able to fly.

What the monk in his kindness and haste did not understand was that the restricting cocoon and the struggle required for the butterfly to get through the tiny opening were God's way of forcing fluid from the body of the butterfly into its wings, so that it would be ready for flight once it achieved its freedom from the cocoon. Freedom and flight could only come after a struggle.

We are so like the monk who wants to rush through this season of Advent, a season of waiting. We want to rush through this season of anticipation and preparation to the joy and celebration. In rushing through the season of Advent, we miss opportunities to have our lives transformed and re-formed by God's spirit. Waiting is sometimes a struggle between who we are and what is yet to come.

Spend time this season of Advent waiting and preparing your lives for the Christ child that is to come once again into our midst.

Children in Ministry

Election coverage had barely ended when I saw a huge “45” on our TV screen – the number of days until Christmas. Of course, the commercial was designed to get me to want more, shop more, and buy more and more! I’d been reading Adam Hamilton’s *Enough*, and I found the “45”, and the ad that followed, to be an offensive reminder that I might actually BE “less and less”

if I did not buy “more and more”. I wondered how Christmas has become so very commercialized and how our children will come to understand the meaning of the birth of Christ – *big wish lists? lots of presents? busy-busy?* Did Jesus get lost in all of it? Epworth will have a number of Advent opportunities to help you and your children retreat from overindulgence to make time the real meaning of Christmas. Advent is most simply the way the church prepares for Christmas. The Children’s Council is planning a Family Advent Workshop (Dec. 1) that focuses not on the gift giving and getting, but on God’s preparation for the birth of a Savior, and our activities, stories, snacks and crafts will be fun and spiritual. Our participation in the Live Nativity at the Fairgrounds (Dec. 23) will be a time to “be” in that place where the Christ Child was born. The Children’s Christmas Musical (Dec. 16) will provide a child-size perspective of the journey to Bethlehem and the roles that each of us have in that journey. The Las Posadas tradition of the figurines of Mary and Joseph visiting homes within our congregation is one that families with children of all ages will enjoy – have you signed up? And the 7:00 Christmas Eve service of lessons and carols will be blessed with the music of the Children’s Choir. The huge number “45” has, by now, become a huge “30”, and yes, I have done *some* shopping and decorating, but I’m looking to find my joy, and my peace, in the sharing and experiencing the Christmas Story with children. I hope that you and your children will also experience this joy as you join us in Advent activities at Epworth.

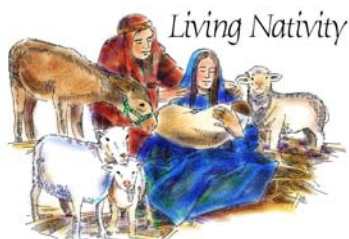
Carey Ecumenical Christmas Concert

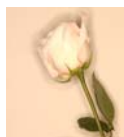

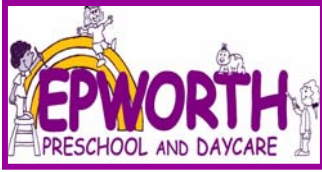

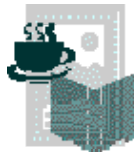
Christmas is an exciting time of the year no matter where you are and especially at
