One of the blessings of being Chair of the Administrative Council at Epworth is to work alongside the chairs and members of our ten committees. The chairs, officers, and staff, along with at-large members and representatives from United Methodist Women, Scouts,



and Preschool/Daycare, meet monthly to guide the work of Epworth and approve important decisions. It is also useful to hold a larger meeting once a year for all, to plan and coordinate the year ahead. We held a special Leadership Day on January 11th. All committee members and Council members were invited, as well as anyone in the church who wished to attend. As a part of the day, Pastor David Hoffman led us in individual and group exercises to determine the accomplishments of 2013 and set some goals for 2014, and I'd like to share many of the thoughts of the day with you.

The accomplishments for 2013 at Epworth were many. In worship, we have more members involved in our services, more music participants, more opportunities for spiritual growth, increased family involvement, and a strong children's ministry that is well supported by the congregation. We have increased our giving and activity in missions and added a very successful Grief Share program to our already well-established Divorce Care, Divorce Care for Kids, and Marion Matters programs. We have also had a successful transition to our new Preschool/Day Care Director. We have strengthened the organization of our church administration, personnel, and most importantly, finances. We have increased our giving, reduced our debt, and now have year-round stewardship education. Needed repairs to the organ were begun, and the Trustees are beginning to plan for a Capital Campaign to address some of our long-term building needs. Overall, the group had an increased feeling of joy in our congregation as a whole.

The goals in 2014 are to continue to increase congregational participation in worship, mission, and committees, and to provide more opportunities during the Sunday School hour. We'd like to strengthen our outreach to new, previous, missing, and non -attending members of Epworth. We would like to increase congregational care and opportunities for both our more senior members and our young adults, support an active youth ministry for middle school and high school students, and to continue to find more outreach and partnership opportunities in the community. In 2014, we would like to develop a strong, modern internal communication plan (website, email, etc.) and promote a positive community presence outside our walls. The final goals are to put in place a successful Capital Campaign, and to come closer to paying 100% of all of our apportionments.

The 2014 goals will be sent on to their respective committees for further refinement and development as the year progresses. If you have ideas for additional goals, or have an interest in providing energy or leadership in any area, please let me or Pastor Hoffman know. I thank you for your continual, faithful, and dedicated commitment to "God's Love in Action".

I met Roger Kingsley when I was 11 years old. Roger was a firefighter, who lived with his wife and young daughter on Marion's west end. But, I knew Roger because he was my scoutmaster. Every month, for many years, Roger used some of his time off work to go on campouts with the troop. Roger modeled Christian values to hundreds of scouts who passed through the troop. He showed us how living a life of generosity can make a difference in the lives of others, including my own.

Many years later I met Heidi Schweinfurth. Heidi has a remarkable ability to sense the needs of others before they are even expressed, along with a willingness to reach out to meet those needs. Sometimes this was for a friend. Other times, it was a clerk at the store, or even a complete stranger.

I married Heidi and for over 30 years she has continued to teach me about generosity. I used to tell Heidi that we don't need to get involved, or that it wasn't a convenient time. Sometimes I wasn't comfortable reaching out. Other times I thought Heidi was just imagining a need someone had. However, I discovered that Heidi's sense about what was needed was almost always right.

What I have learned from Roger and Heidi, and continue to learn, is that being generous requires me to take off my blinders, set aside my schedule, and risk putting the needs of others ahead of my own.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY




When some of our daycare children did not have a grandparent in attendance on "Grandparent's Day", Epworth volunteers filled in the gap. I watched a little boy's eyes light up when Jack Shoaf sat down with him. Suddenly, the craft wasn't dumb anymore, because "Grandpa" Jack made it fun. Each week at Epworth, I have glimpses of how Epworth loves the little children.

Our building is filled with preschool and daycare children Monday-Friday. We have an excellent team of Sunday School teachers, who, though their own children are grown, make time to learn stories and to create lessons and to listen to children. We have adults who think that learning those Bible stories is so important that they have contributed their time, energy, and resources to Godly Plays. We have parents who lead the Children's Worship time with snacks from home and a lesson prepared to share the Bible in a way that a child can connect. Volunteers direct our Children's Choir and Children's Musical. Nearly 40 adult volunteers participate in our Vacation Bible School. Our members are sincere when they congratulate a child who has just been baptized. One of our members offers her services as tutor for a child every week. Our members generously support the Pancake Breakfast and Sausage Sale to make church camps affordable for their families. Most importantly, we welcome the children in worship, not only to partake of the bread and wine of Holy Communion, but to be Communion Stewards, Acolytes, and vocalists. February is a month to show our love. Here at Epworth, we love the little children all yearlong. We are the church together. Thanks be to God!

Conversations to Have with Your Kids

the world, people have explored the concentric rings of labyrinths to meditate, to discover, that by simply starting on the path, one can obtain the goal, and to pray. Some people walk the labyrinth with specific intent to address a specific issue or help answer a question or make a decision. There is no one "right way" to use the labyrinth. Epworth will have the use of a labyrinth in our parlor for March 3 - 9 as part of our Lenten

Journey. Come on your own time, to explore, to satisfy your curiosity, and to experience the peace of walking the labyrinth. Guiding instructions will be provided. And if you are curious, but find walking to be difficult, there will also be a finger labyrinth available to use while you sit at a table.

SUCCESSFUL FUNDRAISER \$1,200 donated

Following worship on January 12, approximately 90 people enjoyed the delicious soup and salad lunch prepared by our good friend, Bill Staats; many of whom then gathered in the sanctuary to enjoy the

"After Christmas – Christmas Concert" performed by Epworth members and friends who shared their time and musical talents.

This event was planned as a fundraiser in support of the Imagine No Malaria campaign. In 2010, one person (usually a child or pregnant woman) died of malaria every 30 seconds. That number has been cut in half, but still one person dies every minute from malaria, and one is too many. The campaign goals include: distributing insecticide-resistant mosquito bed nets, providing health care workers to teach proper net usage and simple ways to prevent malaria, providing up-to-date treatment, and improving communication networks to share health information.
