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Pastor's Ponderings It is somehow not Christmas until I hear the carol, "In the Bleak Midwinter". It was written in 1872 by Christina Rossetti and is one of my favorites. It is not Christmas until I hear these words. It is a different kind of carol; not well known to many; and is usually not one of those carols that are overheard while shopping. It is somewhat desperate and desolate in its images of winter and the scene at the nativity: bleak, frosty, moaning wind, earth as hard as iron, water frozen as if stone, the oppressive snow-- snow falling on snow. These images are not too hard for us to imagine; they are palpable and real to the touch. We can feel the cold chill and the weight of the snow. For me, this carol recognizes the harsh realities that often exist in and around us -- even at this time of the year -- experiences in which we have passed through and journeys that we are currently taking into a New Year. It is into these realities that Christ is born.

As the verses continue to unfold, we begin to realize that nothing -- nothing is impossible with God; that light begins to flicker and emerge in the darkness; and the cold harsh realities of the world begin to melt in the embrace of a mother's arms.

And yet, in the final verse, we are confronted with a question -- the question of the Christmas story. In response to this great gift -- this great event -- what can I/we, offer? Not something purchased or sold – but something unique to each one of us. What can <u>we</u> give? What are <u>we</u> ready to give, to do our part in response to the birth of Christ once again into our midst? It is so easy for us to imagine in our mind's eye what we would give if we were someone else – a shepherd – we would bring a lamb – a wise man – we would bring treasures from distant lands. But that is not the gift that is required.

What if we already posses what we are intended to give? What if we already possess that which we are to give to others and that is already found within our heart? What if that is what is required of us?

Our love -- Christ's love -- can do impossible things and melt the harsh realities in this world. What can we give? We can give our hearts.

Let us be mindful of the words of this carol as we enter into 2014. We are called to give our very best.

Thank you for all of your expressions of kindness, love, and generosity!

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

By far, the most popular Godly Play story among our children at Epworth is the Story of Holy Baptism. Children frequently get the story materials off the shelf to retell the story themselves. I've been watching and wondering why this is so. Perhaps, I thought, it's

because there is a small cruet of water to pour into a bowl --- and children always love to play with water. Or, I pondered, it's because there is a doll in a white dress, and they enjoy playing with dolls. Or is it the dove, our symbol for the Holy Spirit, because it's fun to move the dove like the wind? Or the Christ Candle (sans flame) from which the infant being baptized receives her Light? Or maybe, it's just because a friend likes the story...but could that be true in more than one Sunday School class? No, there must be something more going on here. The children watch intently when Pastor David gently baptizes an infant or child in our worship service, and their eyes follow him as he carries the child around the sanctuary. Some children in the Sunday School classes have been baptized, others have not. Yet, the children seem to know that names are important. They seem to marvel that so much light can come from One Light, and they are eager to receive that Light into their lives. We will celebrate the Baptism of Jesus on January 12. REMIND 101 - for Children and Families

To increase communications about Epworth happenings that are relevant to children and their parents, we've set up a one-way mass texting system called Remind 101. Once you've signed up, you will receive brief messages via text or email (your preference) to remind you of Epworth children's ministry events. You will not be able to reply to any of these messages, but you will have current information about Epworth events for children. This system is a "safe sanctuary" system - if your kids have cell phones, you may decide to sign them up so they can also receive the messages. Remind 101 is a free messaging system, so we have not used any ministry funds to make this possible, and there is no fee to receive the messages. Children's ministry volunteers may find it helpful to sign up, too --- forgotten what time the movie night begins? which Sunday the children's choir is singing?, or wondering if the picnic is still ON after the storm? Remind 101 messages will give you the answer! You must sign up to receive the Remind 101 messages. It's pretty easy! All you need to do is:

Grab your cellphone. Send a text to 614-347-1689 (That's our Remind 101 number)

Text this code to receive "Epworth kids" messages: @epwort (that's right, no h!)

You'll receive occasional messages with info about the children's musical, movie nights, VBS, Sunday School happenings, reminders about what's going on for Epworth kids.

To receive "children's choir" messages, send a text to 614-347-1689 with this code: @9655d

Miss Ruth and Miss Sharon will be sending info about when the choir will sing in worship, when the first practice for the children's musical will be, when the children are singing at Kingston, when & where the choir pizza party will be, etc.

The Grant Committee will choose recipients based on the following criteria:


Church Involvement


Participation in UMC Market is free and easy. Just follow a few simple steps:

ALTERNATIVE GIFT IDEAS FOR 2014!

The Epworth Missions Committee in support of The United Methodist Church two-year campaign for Imagine No Malaria would like to encourage YOU to think of creative ways to contribute to this worthy cause. Below are some possibilities. Whether you can give a little or a lot, it all helps.
