During Lent, we reflect on the sacrifice made by Christ on our behalf through His death on the cross. During Holy Week we remember those last events that occurred before His crucifixion.

On Sunday, March 24th, the Chancel Choir will present a unique worship experience in the form of a cantata entitled "Canticle of the Cross." Through music, narration, and visuals, you will experience the events that led up to Christ's death. The word "canticle means "song," and this cantata looks at Christ's death through the eyes of the

"tree" on which He died. A "tree" in Eden had brought death to God's creation. but THIS "tree" would bring Eternal Life. PalmSunday is also known as Passion Sunday. We will begin the service with the joyful procession of the palms, but ask that you leave the sanctuary in silence as you personally reflect on Christ's death. Please join us on March 24th as we remember God's ultimate gift of sacrificial love for us.

This Is Why We Are Here!

This has been a difficult and unusual beginning to the New Year... many members and friends of our congregation have experienced deaths in their families since the beginning of the year – and even more have if you go back to Advent and just before Christmas. Just in the past week or so, several more members have lost family members; several have had significant medical issues come to light; and several members have had to transition from their homes to extended care facilities and assisted care living. So far, it has been a difficult year for many of us.

"Difficult" is not really a sufficient word to describe the experiences that some are going through. Grief-stricken, devastating, soul-numbing, heartrending, hopeless, helpless, disheartening, insurmountable, unbelievable...but fortunately, these aren't the last words for us.

During each funeral service that I have the opportunity to preach, there is always a time during the service either through spoken liturgy or through the reflection upon scripture and the celebration of that person's life that I speak the words, "Thanks be to God!" Thanks be to God...for sharing that person's life with us! Thanks be to God...for their example of faith! Thanks be to God...for their witness of God's love to us!

Thanks be to God.

"Thanks be to God", indeed! God is the source of all comfort, and God does bring peace to us as we struggle with these truly difficult situations and trials that come to all of us. And because of Jesus' death on the cross, and because Jesus was raised from the dead, and because, through our baptism and faith, we are connected with Jesus in that death and resurrection, we, too, are called from death to life. God truly speaks to us, heals us, strengthens us - and as we experience God's comforting presence, we are able to comfort others. We are drawn together to care for and support each other. God uses the Body of Christ - the church – all of us - to support and care for each other.

So share your burdens with one another. Support each other, care for each other. Don't just *care about* each other. That's too distant, too unfeeling, too easy, and not real. *Care for* each other. Do you see the difference? To *care about* something or someone, makes us feel good but does nothing for the person in need. But to *care for* someone, well, that's where Jesus comes into the situation. *Care for* each other. That's why we're here!

Betty English faithfully guides our Acolyte Fellowship Sunday School Class of 3^{rd} , 4^{th} , and 5^{th} graders. She recently sent this message to me: "Once again, Doug Warne did a great job telling the Godly Play story of The Parable of the Good Shepherd and asked the wondering questions. As the children were responding, and we were almost ready to

break up the circle to move to response time, Abby Austin said, with a look of amazement on her face, "We are the sheep!" Followed quickly by, "Why didn't I get that before? We are the sheep!" It was an "Ah-ha!" moment." We're all a bit like Abby, aren't we? The Bible passages that we have heard and read many times, reveal new insights to us. This room for growth, and this expectation of new understanding, is part of what I love about being a United Methodist. We need not understand everything to accept the grace given to us in baptism. Children are welcomed at the communion table, knowing only that Jesus loves them. And the weeks of Lent can become 40 days not only "giving up" something, but also 40 days of building our faith with new understandings. Our Family Lent Event is designed to be a fun way for young and older to grow in understanding of the Easter Story. Thanks be to God for the parents, teachers, storytellers and pastors who guide us, and the learners who find joy in the "ah-ha" moments along our lifelong faith journey.

CRAFTING WITH PHYLLIS





This is the time of the year when the winter weather seems to stretch out to be too long and almost never ending. Whenever the


