May Flowers

Like you, I have heard the expression "April Showers Bring May Flowers" many times. I always had supposed that meant that April was the rainiest month of the year. At bare minimum, I thought the saying meant that April (has much more precipitation on average than May. I recently found that at least in Marion, neither is the case. Data I located on the average monthly precipitation levels in Marion (1981-2010) revealed that May is the rainiest month of the year, followed by July, June, and then April. I wondered if there was some place in the United States where April is the rainiest month with May far behind and, on a cursory search, found none.

Clearly my powers of observation about the weather around me are dull, clouded by wishful thinking. Every year I have expected the heavy rains that make April so dreary to come to an end so that sunshiny May yields color, fragrance, and flowers in blossom.

Who in the world dreamt up that oft-repeated phrase and why? It originates from 1557, composed by Thomas Tusser, an English farmer and author of the popular A Hundred Good Points of Husbandry, in which he wrote:

"Sweet April showers Do spring May flowers."

One commentator suggests that "April showers bring May flowers" is a reminder that even the most unpleasant of things, in this case the heavy rains of April, can bring about very enjoyable things indeed - in this case, an abundance of flowers in May. And so it is a lesson in patience, something akin to "good things come to those who wait." Perhaps in England April is rainy and May sunny? Not so—in England the difference between the average precipitations between April and May is even greater than it is here. May, with its flowers is much rainier than April.

Therefore, perhaps the real wisdom of the saying is that though the dreary rains life periodically brings continue and even intensify, finding beauty and new life blossom in their midst make them all worthwhile.

Many things are blooming at Epworth in May. We are kicking off the rainiest of months with Over the Rainbow, an inspiring evening of music, fellowship, and food for all ages on Sunday, May 6. Come and bring family, friends, neighbors, and strangers. Later in the month we will celebrate the Confirmation of seven wonderful young people, and then baptisms, graduations, and scholarships. Sunday, May 20 worship will feature special music to honor and celebrate and give thanks for Mark Stoneburner's eighteen years of outstanding service as Director of the Chancel Choir. Mark will direct the choir for the last time on Sunday, June 3 but, thankfully, will not say goodbye to Epworth!

I hope and pray that your May is full of beauty and blossoms.


GRADUATES

Opiate Drug Abuse in Marion: Awareness, Prevention, Treatment

I have heard many of you express the opinion that drug abuse is one of the most significant obstacles to healthy community that Marion, city and county, faces. Marion and Crawford Counties have joined to form an Opiates Task Force and they have put together *an informational presentation about the problem of drug abuse*, especially prescription drug abuse, in order to get the word out to the community. I wanted to make it possible for Epworth to have the best possible attendance and so I invited *Jodi Demo-Hodgins, Executive Director of the Marion-Crawford Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health Services*, to come *Sunday morning, May 27 at the 9:30-10:20 education hour to share about awareness, prevention, and treatment related to opiate drug abuse.* Her presentation will last about 20-25 minutes, which will allow time for questions before 10:30 worship. We will meet in Fellowship Hall. I encourage all adults and youth of the church to come and become a positive force for change in our community! - Rev. Ogle

Children in Ministry



It is rare for a week to go by without a news story of alleged abuse of children or youth --somewhere-- by persons who were entrusted to teach and help them. We would be foolish to believe that churches are immune to such tragedy. The United Methodist Church is committed to the rights of children to be nurtured and protected

through Safe Sanctuary – a required policy to be developed by each congregation. In recent months a task force of parents and professionals from the congregation has developed such a policy for Epworth. Approved by the Administrative Council on April 19, the Safe Sanctuary Policy addresses the recruiting, screening and training of volunteers for ministries involving children and youth. It is a policy developed to prevent the occurrence of abuse of children and youth, as well as to protect church employees and volunteers from suspicion of abuse. Staff and volunteer training in Safe Sanctuary Procedures will begin with Vacation Bible School volunteers and mission trip leaders, and within a few months include all persons involved in the ministries with children and youth. The procedures will clearly identify safe practices of staff, volunteers, parents and the congregation at Epworth. Many of the practices are not new, but our intent to communicate with parents, staff and volunteers about Safe Sanctuary has never been clearer. We are grateful to members of the task force and the parents who have increased our sensitivity to their concerns. Call me if you'd like to be in conversation about Safe Sanctuary!

Jesus taught, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." Providing a safe place for children to be nurtured is one way that we do so. We are blessed to be in ministry with children. Sharon Gilbert



New York June 16-23 Hurricane Irene Relief Catskill/Hudson Region

Rebuilding Homes & Restoring Hope

Many families continue to deal with the adverse effects of the Hurricane Irene destruction that occurred last September 2011. Over 1,584 individuals from the Greene County area alone applied for FEMA assistance. More than 300 households are in need of various assistance.



Disaster response volunteers from the New York Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church were on the ground immediately after the storm, working with local agencies to provide relief to survivors. We are now in the recovery phase, rebuilding homes and restoring hope.

What To Expect:

- 1. <u>Type of work</u>: Rebuilding: installing insulation, hanging sheet rock, replacing doors, cabinets, fix-tures, painting, trim work, etc.
- 2. Areas/towns being worked in: Prattsville, Lexington, West Kill, Fleischmanns, and Margaretville.


