Children in Ministry

Busy parents, and the rest of us, may be challenged when it comes to a daily spiritual practice of reading the Bible, but finding God in the everyday --- well, that's easy when you're among children. I love my conversations with kids, and they often share their understandings of God. They tell me

that God is strong, that God made the sun and the earth, and that God loves everybody, no matter what! When I ask children to lead us in prayer, there may be several eager volunteers. No memorized verse is required; they simply talk to God. Their prayer might be as short as "Thank you, God!" or a long list of thank yous and requests. Listening to their petitions, I am amazed that they understand that God is not Santa Claus who brings the latest and greatest toy or electronic item. They ask God to help a loved one get well, or a finger boo-boo to stop hurting. They ask God for the bullying to stop. Our DC4K children ask for parents to get along during drop-off and pick-up times. They ask God to be with a DC4K friend who is absent from the group. They wonder why God doesn't make their parents love each other. Through all these encounters with children and their God, I am seeing that, at a very young age, children do have a personal relationship with their Creator. In DC4K, we help children to focus on the positive by asking one child to be the "kindness reporter", and as they list all of the ways the group members have been kind to one another, the presence of God in their lives is so very clear. Wondering where God is in the midst of busy days? Listen to the children - wherever they are, God is. With a grateful heart, Sharon




